


Total Count - Age Group




Our Library

Toward Healing & Renewal


The 2012 Symposium on the Sexual Abuse of Minors held at the Pontifical Gregorian University

On Feb 6, 2012, an international symposium gathered at the Gregorian Pontifical University in Rome to address the problem of sexual abuse of minors by the representatives of the Catholic Church, especially the priests. Its purpose was to make an honest examination of conscience and begin the work of healing this wound in the Body of Christ. With love inspired by the Gospel, the participants strove to create the beginnings of a culture in which effective protection of the vulnerable and support for victims can become a reality. Their work is presented in this book.

Metaphysics

This book is for students who have already completed an introductory philosophy course and need a fresh look at the central topics in the core subject of metaphysics.
